



Immunizations, Vaccines & Medications

All travelers should be up to date on routine vaccinations before traveling. These vaccines include measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine, diphtheria-tetanus- pertussis vaccine, varicella (chickenpox) vaccine, polio vaccine, and your yearly flu shot. [L] [SEP]

Hepatitis A, Malaria, Typhoid, and Yellow Fever are recommended by the Center for Disease Control for travel to Uganda. The Yellow Fever Vaccination is a requirement to attend the trip and proof must be brought to Uganda. We also strongly recommend Malaria medication.

Please note: Depending on what your family decides in consultation with your physician, these medications can cost several hundred dollars. We want you to have an accurate picture of the cost of this, so you are not surprised when you go to get them.

Because of a total depletion of YF-Vax, the manufacturer (Sanofi Pasteur) has worked with CDC and the US Food and Drug Administration to make an alternative yellow fever vaccine, Stamaril, available at select locations until YF-Vax supply returns, which is not expected until 2020.
