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#### Closing Up a Blessed Year, 2016

The end of the school year in Uganda commenced in December, and the first Assembly of Excellence was held at God Cares High School. Awards of achievement were given to both the top teacher and various students in chosen categories of studies. This award program was a direct result of a donation from Oaks Christian School in California that had awarded

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purchased outright for the future home of the third God Cares School, (in the second largest city in Uganda to Kampala) our school building efforts there are on hold. There are still funds needed for the fencing and financial support for the land's caregiver, to watch over it well. However, Buyamba has decided that we should first finish our efforts at God Cares High School campus with the ASSEMBLY HALL and STUDENT DORMS, before we endeavor to launch a third school. Worship Dongo said it best, "We are called to be good stewards of God's ministry."

## What Happens at Term Break?

The students packed up their bags at the last day of school in December, and waited to be picked up by their parent or guardian in the expectation of a long break at home in their villages with family (or guardians) and friends. This year, many students at both schools were sent home with Christmas baskets from their sponsors, loaded with pantry staples that would last their family through the holidays and much of term break. Life is very different in the children's villages. Many of them live in slums and extreme poverty. Some do not have running water or electricity. They may not receive three meals a day like they do at school. Others live with guardians or with only one parent, because they have lost one or both parents to any of the various diseases such as malaria, AIDS, and even simple infections. Life will be different until school begins with a new grade level on February 6th.

Some students may have to actually work during the term break, depending on their age and their family's financial needs, to help care for their family. Many will help at least with domestic chores at home and attend church activities in their village. The highlight for many of the high school students was attending the annual church youth camp put on by a ministry team called Reaction Tour. The them was WORLD CHANGERS and it certainly impacted over 500 youths for the Lord.
