THE U.S. BUYAMBA STORY Part 4: Buyamba Migrates to Florida

When Pastor Dongo began to share in California in 2001, the vision expanded into churches, schools, and small groups. Terry Mendel, and her husband Tom, happened to be at a service at Calvary Community Church, where Pastor Dongo was introduced to the congregation to share what God was doing in Uganda with God Cares Schools, and then she re-encountered him at a small group, led by Degna Horton (a founding California Buyamba board member). After listening to Pastor Dongo, the Lord planted Buyamba deep in Terry's heart when she met "the man with the big smile who was full of love." Terry knew she needed to help... but how?



Terry looked at what she had to give, and she and Tom decided they could provide not only their own financial support but also Terry's "connections." Terry grew up in Sebring, Florida and had a house there where her family spent part of each year. She knew many churches, helped several pastors in ministry across the globe who she hosted in Florida, and knew she could also introduce Pastor Dongo to some local churches. The Mendels had also been blessed with a small house they called "The Missionary House," for God had sent a few pastors from around the world that the couple was called to help. Dongo would turn out be a regular tenant of that house every other year for a few weeks on his visits to the United States.

This visit would include Sebring, Florida and the surrounding areas, such as Sarasota.

There he also visited another Buyamba ambassador, Rebecca Ronan, who Dongo had met in Argyle, Texas at Cross Timbers Church, for Buyamba continued to spread from the Houston area to Dallas/Ft. Worth. Rebecca had gone on a short-term mission trip to God Cares School for the first time in 2007 to help with the Bible Camp. Later when she moved halfway across the country, she began using her connections to share Buyamba in Florida. Thus, the Buyamba hub in Florida continued to grow through both of the efforts of these two Buyamba Ambassadors.

Dongo was close to the Mendel family and had an impact on them. Two of their children would end up visiting God Cares School. Dongo affectionately called Terry, "Mum Terry" for she took good care of him, and so many others. Terry remembers one time they had a big buffet dinner. Dongo reflected, as he sat before a plentiful meal, "Oh how I wish I could bring the children here." She asked him what happened to those children that don't get taken in by others. With deep sadness in his eyes, he said "some of them just die...they can't make it without help. "Although this tore at her heart, she knew that Buyamba meant "help" for these children. Terry introduced Dongo to many churches over the years and to faithful sponsors who continue to "help" in the Buyamba ministry today.
