
A Short Term Mission Trip Reflection by Anna Pitonyak

When I recently visited God Cares High School, a significant thing that stood out to me, besides how large it was, were the encouraging phrases and affirmations painted on the building and hallways throughout the school. One of the goals of our trip was to teach at least two high school classes basic hygiene practices such as proper handwashing, coughing into the inside of your elbow, and so on.
